

#### Cathy Brown

Cathy Brown was born and raised in Youngstown, Ohio until her family moved to North Carolina when she was 16. She graduated from Charles E. Jordan High School in Durham, earned a bachelor's degree in psychology and human services from St. Andrews Presbyterian College and later earned a master's degree in youth development and consumer science from North Carolina State University. She married a local farmer, Cameron L. Brown. She moved to Hoke County in 1983 and joined the Raeford Woman's Club. She became involved in many community projects including the

North Carolina Turkey Festival Committee, where she served for 20 years. She is also an annual volunteer for the Raeford-Hoke Museum's Colonial Day event. She is employed with the Hoke County Cooperative Extension and serves as the 4-H extension agent. In 2005 she founded Agricultural Field Day, which takes all the county's third graders to the Edens Farm and Cotton Gin where students have the chance to pick cotton and taste foods grown on local farms. Brown was elected president of the North Carolina 4-H Association in 2011.

#### Barbara Buie

Barbara Buie was born and raised in Jamaica, New York and attended Upchurch Elementary School and Boylan-Haven Mather Academy and then earned a degree from Tennessee State University. She worked as a buyer for Macy's department store before relocating to Hoke County in 1977. Buie became known as "The Literacy Lady" for her work with the Hoke Reading Literacy Council, where she served for many years. Buie often said she was married to her job of promoting literacy among Hoke County's residents. She eventually became executive director of the Hoke Reading Literacy Council and worked with the council for 30 years. She retired in 2008 and was later elected to the Hoke County Board of Education, where she currently serves. Buie is secretary of the local chapter of the N.C. Federation of Negro Women's Club and also serves that club on the state level in the position of chairperson of the by-laws and constitution committee. She is secretary of the Hoke County Civic League, a member of the Hoke Reading Literacy Council Board, the Hospice Foundation Board, the Community Cemetery Committee and the FirstHealth Advisory Committee.

#### Brenda Jacobs

Brenda Jacobs was born in Robeson County and grew up in Hoke County, where her family moved shortly after her birth. She attended the Hawkeye School and during her years there was head of the cheerleading squad and a member of the girls' championship (See WOMEN, page 3B)



She was employed with the Robeson County school system and became involved in the Hoke County school system as a way to support her own children's education. She is mother to Richard, Rebecca and Rhonda. Jones served on the Indian Education Board from 1976 until 1993 and held the position of parent committee chairperson for four of those years. She also served in the youth department of Dundarrach Baptist Church for 12 years. She began working with the Lumbee Regional Development Association in 1982 and later became employed with the North Carolina Commission of Indian Affairs. She also worked in Hoke County as a counselor with the Title IV Indian Education program. Jones has held membership in the National Association of Indian Education, the N.C. Department of Social Services, the N.C. Association of Rural Minority Women and the Hoke County Native American Council. In recent years she has focused on service in the missions field as part of the Burnt Swamp Baptist Association's Women's Missionary Union.

#### Charlotte Kelly

Charlotte Kelly was born and raised in Connecticut and earned a degree in business administration. Early in her career, she traveled back and forth between her home and Philadelphia while working with an African American newspaper called the Philadelphia Tribune. She credited two influential teachers, Mrs. Wright and Mrs. Taylor, and her friend Della Maynor for much of her success. She relied on a support group of friends, family and God when faced with difficulties. During her time with the Clerk of Court's office, Lowery learned many new skills and made sure to pass that knowledge on to her team in the court system. After retiring, Lowery took on the role of caregiver for her mother, who has Alzheimer's disease. She also serves as church secretary at New Beginning Baptist Church. She is married to Tony Lowery. She is the mother of Chris and Colin and stepmother of Juanita and Wenona.
